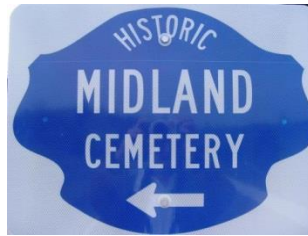

Application for Burial of Deceased Soldiers

In accordance with the provisions of the acts of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, the purpose of which is that the County Commissioners of any County in the State of Pennsylvania are authorized and directed to contribute the sum of Twenty-five Dollars to aid in defraying the expense of burial of any honorably discharged soldier, sailor or marine, who served in the army or navy of the United States during any war in which the United States shall have been engaged, or who at the time of death was in the service of the United States as a soldier, sailor or marine, or member of the enlisted Nurse Corp, who shall have had a legal residence in the County making said contribution.

Paul Carey

Paul is a Social Studies teacher at the Milton Hershey School in Hershey PA. He is also serving as the chairman of the Social Studies Department for the Middle Division. Paul has served as a teacher and leader in Milton Hershey for the past 13 years. He is a graduate of Temple Univ with a Master's degree in African American Studies and a Bachelor's degree from State Univ of NY at Buffalo in Political Science and African American studies. While in Buffalo he served as vice president of campus NAACP and President of Cora P Maloney College; a school at the University dedicated to community activism and direct action.

Since moving to the Harrisburg area from NY in 1993, Paul Co-founded Sankofa 21, a local community group that makes presentations throughout the county on issues impacting African Americans and also preserving the rich history of Africans throughout the Diaspora. He is also the co-founder of the Harrisburg chapter of the National Pan-Hellenic council and the Camp Curtin Toastmaster club at the Camp Curtin School. Additionally, he is a life member of Kappa Alpha Psi fraternity where he served as the province as social action chairman for 25 years and is currently the treasurer for the local chapter.

Paul has been recognized for his work in education and community service on numerous occasions. Winner of the 1989 outstanding young Man of America award; 2006 Who's Who among American Teacher's,

2001 ACE award winner for outstanding collaborative work at the Milton Hershey School. 2009 Winner of the Sankofa award from Imani African Christian Church for community service, 2010 award winner from Dayspring ministries Arms around the community award. In 1985 and 2001, he was selected as Kappa Man of the year in New York and winner of the Grand Polemarch award for community service. Paul is also an Eagle Scout and a member of The National Eagle Scout Association and was inducted into the Order of the Arrow as a brotherhood member in 1975.

Paul H. Carey was born in New York, New York. He is oldest of two boys. He is married to the lovely Yolonda Carey of Hopkinsville Kentucky. He has 4 children Anthony of Huntsville Ala, Cynthia of New York, and his two youngest daughters Yasmin and Rickia Carey.

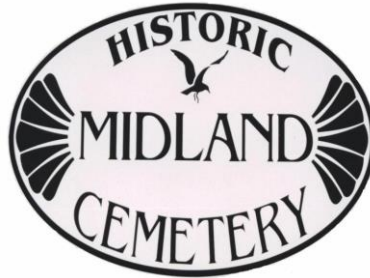
